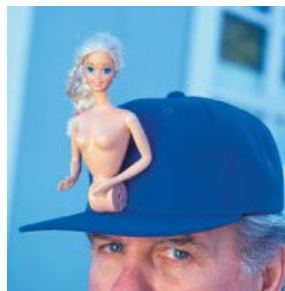

ASP databases are set apart by the high quality of their content: this publisher actively pursues rare (in some cases, previously unpublished) content and works with subject specialists to provide context in the form of descriptions, essays, images, programs from performances and more.

The indexing has been designed for scholarly work so that titles can be searched in full text together with such criteria as genre, author gender, ethnic identity, or sexual orientation. It is also genre-specific: while primary documents can be searched using categories such as life events, drama can be searched by character name and occupation.

Each search category is also browseable, making these databases a joy to peruse. With resources for literature, film, music, theatre, and the social sciences, ASP has something for everyone!
