But despete these difficulties it did not sum responsible to bow out as long as I could contribute to the foundness and credibility of our effort. Frially the message has come through: that it is time for you to find a quesilent who can command the respect and confidence necessary to keep the lines of communication and responsibility clear. If your Treasurer will consent to become licting President until the annual some ting in February, you will be way ahead. and should you fromt me to continue covering the LON I will be in a position to do a better job.
