Dear Millie

This stuff is all ready for offset. We'll need copies for the Organizing Committee and for all the funders. I think that both Lynda and I would like a copy as well. I don't know who else you want to send it to. The newspaper sets are in RWH's office. I don't know if you want to use these little folders or not.

I've clipped together the various sections, and I think that, after duplicating and collating, they should be stapled together to avoid confusion. The copy was typed in the office next to yours.

The missing thing is the Introduction which I think that you will want to write yourself. I would suggest that, since the definite numbers of registrants and the Directory won't be available for a few weeks yet, you may want to include a paragraph noting that approximately 6000 persons registered from over 82 countries, and that the Directory will be available shortly. Persons interested should write to the Conference of NGOs. I have a copy of the papers, and what is left here is the only other set. I don't know what you want to do with them.

The Introduction should also mention the following names, in my opinion, and thanks to them for making the administration of this thing possible: Aida Gonzalez Martinez, Sandra Fuentes Berain and all her staff, Jacqui Starkey, Margaret Sapir, Joyce Pandolfi, Mark Muenze, Stephen Viederman, Baldwin Sharpe and Selinda Melnik. All these people worked very hard and in a most dedicated and committed manner behind the counter, in the press office, and making daily summaries of the official sessions. I personally don't feel that I would have survived without such a loyal and hard-working team. This is, of course, beyond the names listed as staff on the printed programme, and you may have other names to add of persons who were particularly helpful to you. If you think it ~~is~~ appropriate, I think that special mention should also be given to Joan Dunlop and Virginia Saurwein for their constant support and encouragement. If you don't think that this should go in the report I would like it very much if you and I could draft a letter to these people and also one to the Organizing Committee thanking them for all their efforts which we both could sign.

I might also suggest that the Introduction include the names of persons added to the Organizing Committee in Mexico.
