## Academic OneFile

You now have access to **Thomson Gale's Academic OneFile** -- the largest collection of peer-reviewed, full-text periodicals available covering multiple research disciplines. In addition to the nearly 9,000 academic journals, Academic OneFile also includes full-text of major newspapers -- such as the full New York Times to 1995 -- as well as hundreds of podcasts and video from premier publishers. You'll find this database on our [e-Resources web page](#).



Focused on the arts and humanities, the **JSTOR Arts & Sciences III Collection** contains 150 titles (to add to the JStor titles we had before!)

This addition means more journals in language and literature, as well as important titles in the fields of music, film studies, folklore, performing arts, religion, and the history and study of art and architecture.

More than 14,000 new electronic full-length books have been added to our eBook collection.

**NetLibrary eBooks** are easy to use; they are accessible from anywhere, and searching them is fast and efficient.

eBooks are listed in the [online catalog](#) by title, author, and subject, and can be viewed from any computer on campus. To use the collection off-campus, one must create an account from an on-campus computer, and then log in from anywhere to "check out" the desired book.
